### GENERAL SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

- Applicant is a member of the graduating class of 2023 at Abraham Lincoln High School.
- Applicant is seeking to further their education by attending a 2- or 4-year college, Trade or Vocational School or Military Academy.
- Completed applications submitted by the applicant must include:
  - Scholarship Application,
  - Official Transcript of applicant's scholastic record,
  - Activity Record to include activities within Lincoln and the outside community,
  - A one to two page personal statement detailing one's past experiences and future goals, etc.
  - A character reference letter from a current ALHS faculty/staff member.

Completed Scholarship application must be received by 11:59 pm on Sunday, March 12th via e-mail to [scholarships@lincolnalumni.com](mailto:scholarships@lincolnalumni.com).

Scholarship applications received prior to 10pm on Sunday, March 12th will receive a courtesy review for any missing elements and applicants will have an opportunity to submit missing elements. Applications received after this soft deadline will not be reviewed before submission to the full selection committee. Applicants may resubmit their application at any point up to the hard deadline of 11:59 pm on Sunday, March 12th.

Scholarship recipients will be announced on Monday, April 10th. Scholarship recipients and one guest are invited to the Alumni Association to the Wall of Fame dinner on Monday, April 24th where they can receive their award.

- GPA 2.5 or better

*Donated by David and Peter Whitehead. David was the founding president of the Alumni Association. Peter will join his brother on the Wall of Fame in 2022*

- For Exceptional Achievement in the arts, whether visual, dramatic, musical or performing

- Demonstrated character, leadership, and a high level of physical fitness
- Has participated in and given time to charitable giving activities.

**15. The Bill Buckley Memorial Scholarship:**

- 3.0 GPA or better
- Attending a 4 year college
- Good Citizenship
- Active in a school or community activity other than sports

- To go to a top science student intending to study chemistry, biochemistry, biology or physics (*in that order of preference*)

- Attending a 2 or 4 year college
- demonstrates financial need

**18. The John E. Conner Memorial Scholarship**

*Donated by his estate, John Conner was a former Board Member.*

- prefer student be physically disabled or overcame an obstacle, problem or handicap
- may be a Special Education student
- prefer the student be an athlete, but if not that will be okay

**19. The Gwen Chan Scholarship**

*Annual Alumni Association Scholarship in recognition of former principal and SFUSD Superintendent, Gwen Chan.*

- A GPA of 3.0 or better
- Attending a 4 year college
- Good attendance record (no cuts or on unexcused tardy list)
- Contributed at least 3 yrs. to school community
- A person of sound character (no suspensions or disciplinary actions take

**20. The Eddie O'Malley Memorial Scholarship**

*Donated by Florence O'Malley, former dean at Lincoln, in memory of her brother Eddie O'Malley (Class of Spring 1957)*

- Excellent citizenship
- 2.0 or better GPA
- Has actively participated in anti-bullying activities/programs or have been bullied (*describe*)
- Attending 2 or 4 year college

**21. The Rick Boyle Memorial Scholarship for Basketball**

*Donated by friends and family in memory of Rick Boyle, who was a Lincoln graduate (Spring 1963) and coach and teacher at ALHS for over 20 years.*

- To go to a girl or boy who has played Varsity basketball for at least 2 years
- Should exhibit good citizenship on and off the court
- A sense of altruism and care for others in honor of Rick Boyle
- Attending a 2 or 4 year college

**22. The Norma Busse Memorial Scholarship**

*Donated by the estate of Norma Busse (Class of Fall 1944)*

- To go to a girl planning on attending U.C. Berkeley
- 3.5 or better GPA
- Should exhibit good citizenship
- Community Service

- Participated in programs for saving the environment
- 2- or 4-year college
- 3.0 or better GPA

**29. The Diane Warden Currier Memorial Scholarship for English**

*Donated by the family of Diane Warden Currier (Class of Fall 1961)*

- For an outstanding English major who champions for equality.
- 2- or 4-year college
- 2.5 or better GPA
- Excels in the qualities of Diane (quickness of wit, speaking her mind, defending the underdog)
- Interested in pursuing writing

**30. The Car Show Scholarship**

*On the last Saturday in September, the Alumni Association holds a car show at ALHS. The money raised from this event helps to fund this scholarship.*
