GENERAL SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

These are the criteria that apply for all scholarships, however, each scholarship has additional criteria.
 □ Applicant is a member of the graduating class of 2024 at Abraham Lincoln High School.
 □ Applicant is seeking to further their education by attending a 2- or 4-year college, trade or vocational school, or military academy.
 □ Completed applications submitted by the applicant must include:
 □ Scholarship Application with all sections completed (pages 2 thru 4).
 □ Transcript of applicant's scholastic record that includes 1st semester of senior year,
 □ Letter of Recommendation from a current ALHS faculty/staff member (may be sent separately).

Completed Scholarship application must be received by 11:59 pm on Monday, March 11th via e-mail to scholarships@lincolnalumni.com.

Scholarship applications received prior to 10pm on Sunday, March 10th will receive a courtesy review for any missing elements, and applicants will have an opportunity to submit missing elements. Applications received after this soft deadline will not be reviewed before submission to the full selection committee. Applicants may resubmit their application at any point up to the hard deadline of 11:59 pm on Monday, March 11th. No applications will be considered after March 11th.

Scholarship recipients will be announced on Monday, April 15th. Each scholarship recipient and one guest is invited to the Alumni Association's Wall of Fame dinner on Monday, April 29th, where they can receive their award.

 - Requirement is only for this scholarship. Sample will not be used in determining eligibility of other scholarships.

- 2.5 or better GPA
- attending a 2- or 4-year college
- excelled in sports, preferably basketball
- can re-apply for the scholarship to continue per 2 reports sent to Soulis family
