# Richard Serra S56

November 2, 1938 - March 26, 2024 Orient, NY

Famed artist Richard Serra, Lincoln High (S56), passed away in March 2024. Mr. Serra was globally recognized for large-scale sculptures that graced public and private spaces in American cities and abroad for more than thirty years. We salute his extraordinary accomplishments, and his shining example of Mustang excellence. Here's an excerpt of Mr. Serra's obituary from the New York Times March 26, 2024:

"Richard Serra was born on Nov. 2, 1938, in San Francisco, the second of three sons of Tony and Gladys (Fineberg) Serra. His father, an immigrant from the Spanish island of Majorca, worked as a pipe fitter at a San Francisco shipyard during World War II. One of the artist's most vivid memories occurred on his fourth birthday, when his father took him to

the shipyard to watch the launching of an enormous tanker.

"All the raw material that I needed is contained in the reserve of this memory, which has become a recurring dream," he later said. Starting when he was 15, Mr. Serra regularly had summer jobs in steel mills in the Bay Area."

2024 ALHS Wall of Fame Ceremony

We were honored to induct Kevin Anderson (S73) into the Abraham Lincoln High School Wall of Fame in 2024.

Following his graduation from ALHS in '73, Kevin went on to become a successful athletic director at the University of Maryland. Kevin's influence in competitive excellence guided Maryland to six national championships, 12 national championship final appearances and 22 trips to the Final Four.

Maryland achieved success academically and athletically during Kevin's tenure. On July 1, 2014, Maryland officially became a member of the Big Ten Conference, ushering in a new era in Terrapin Athletics.



"This is an outstanding conference comprised of flagship research universities," Kevin said in a University of Maryland news release at the time. "Our new peers share our pursuit of both academic and athletic excellence and



our vision to be the best in everything we do." The ALHS Alumni Association salutes Kevin, his family, and Judge Marty Jenkins (S71), who inducted Kevin into the ALHS Wall of Fame in 2024.

# Lincoln Dominates Balboa 35-0 for Second Straight S.F. Section Title

Jamelle Newman saw just one man in front of him. "If I get taken down one-on-one I don't want to face my coaches," Newman said with a laugh. He juked the defensive back, sprinted 76 yards and Lincoln High School, on just the second play of the game against Balboa, was off and running. Literally. It was all the offense the Mustangs needed in a 35-0 San Francisco Section championship game Thursday at Kezar Stadium. In the 99th Turkey Day Game, Lincoln gave up just 84 yards and got 172 yards on 21 carries from Newman to win their second straight city title. It also was the Mustangs' third in four years and 14th overall SFS championship. Lincoln (9-3) advances to the California Interscholastic Federation's tournament, looking for its fourth state title since 2018. It was the 10th section title won by Lincoln coach Phil Ferrigno since arriving in 2002. "Thirty-five nothing, that's pretty impressive," Ferrigno said. "Our kids played great on defense. That's a credit to Jon (Lee) and the entire defensive staff. And we actually completed a couple passes." Indeed, quarterback Andrias Allanigue completed touchdown passes of 65 and 15 yards to Kevin Zhao, and Diego Cristerna rushed for a touchdown, added 10 tackles and recovered a fumble. The victory was thorough and complete. Balboa, which lost 44-7 to Lincoln in last year's title game, finished 7-5. "Balboa always puts up such a good fight, but our guys ran with the ball and our defense hit," Ferrigno said. Did they ever. Balboa never got inside Lincoln's 40-yard line. Balboa's defense played tough, but gave up two long plays in the first half. Newman swept left on the second play of the game, put his foot in ground and was gone on his 76-yard touchdown. "The guys blocked, I ran, everyone did their job," Newman said. Lincoln got to the Balboa 28 on its next series, but Newman got hit hard and Michael Zapata recovered the fumble. From there, the Buccaneers held the next two series, until Allanigue found Zhao over the middle. The ball was tipped, but Zhao hauled it in and sprinted the final 40 yards untouched. "The tip made it easier to catch," said Zhao, who just contributed on special teams in last year's 37-7 win over Balboa in the SFS title game. "I had a feeling I might get a touchdown today if it was thrown to me. To get two is sorta hard to believe. I'm so happy." The Mustangs put it away in the third after a Cristerno fumble recovery. Newman powered over from the 2, his 24th touchdown of the year.

Then Allanigue threw a perfect 15-yard TD strike to Zhao near the end of the third quarter, making it 28-0. Cristerna added a 1-yard plunge late in the fourth to send the game to a running clock.

Afterward, Ferrigno was surrounded by a half-dozen grandchildren and held up 5-year-old Elizabeth while answering questions.

"It's great to win on Thanksgiving," he said. "The turkey just tastes a little bit better. Gravy, too."


