For more than two decades, Mustang Football head coach Phil Ferrigno served as the dedicated and strategic force that led the team to multiple city and statewide high school championships. The Lincoln High Alumni Association salutes Coach Phil, and wishes him the best as he begins his next chapter—Chairman of Lincoln's Physical Ed Department. Below is an excerpt of the San Francisco Chronicle's April 7, 2025 report on Coach Phil's amazing career leading the Mustang football squad.

Legendary Lincoln High School Football coach Phil Ferrigno resigns but will still preach 'dedication, discipline and desire' as PE Chairman

The most recognizable and successful high school football coach since the turn of the century, from one of the country's most recognizable cities, announced Monday that he's stepping away for health reasons. He does so with no regrets.

Phil Ferrigno told his Lincoln of San Francisco team Monday afternoon that after 22 seasons, 10 section and three state championships that 2024 was his last as head coach.

The 62-year-old will stay on as chairman of the school's physical education department and will mentor his players from a distance, no doubt still passing on his three 'D' principles he's hammered home for part of five decades as a football coach: Dedication, discipline and desire. He leaves with a head coaching record at Lincoln of 158-89 which isn't as impressive as the legacy of consistency, toughness and straight ahead, no-nonsense approach.

Both on the field and in the classroom.

Ferrigno is as proud of the program's 100% graduation rate since he took over in 2002 as his 19 playoff appearances and 15 spots in the Turkey Day Game, a Thanksgiving affair that doubles as the Academic Athletic Association/San Francisco Section title game. He was inducted into the San Francisco Prep Hall of Fame in June.

He's a city kid through and through, graduating in 1980 from Riordan, where he played before stints at CCSF and San Francisco State. He then embarked on a 42-year coaching career with previous time at Riordan, CCSF, Sacred Heart Cathedral and Mission.

"It's time to step away and ride off into the sunset," Ferrigno said an hour after telling about 30 of his team players. "The kids were great about it. Once they knew the reasons." Junior tailback Mikey Washington, the AAA's 2024 co-Offensive Player of the Year, was jarred by the news, but then relieved by Ferrigno's ultimate message.

"He's a great coach and a great man and we're going to miss him," said the highly productive tailback, one in a long line of workhorse backs who rushed for 1,942 yards and 27 touchdowns in 11 games last season.

"At the same time, for him to prioritize his family and his health is absolutely the right thing to do.

"Besides, at the end of the day, he'll still be there for us."





Honoring Inspirational Alumni and a Beloved Educator

The Wall of Fame dinner was held on Monday, April 28th at the Family Club in San Francisco. Two alums were honored: Dr.. Rev. Frederick Haynes, III (S1978), the first African-American Valedictorian at Lincoln, who is now Senior Pastor at Friendship-West Baptist Church in Dallas, Texas, and Dr. Helen Dilworth (F1960), soprano and educator. The Distinguished Teacher honoree was retired teacher/Vice Principal Gilbert Chung. Alumni Association scholarship winners also were present and received funds totalling more than \$90,000. A fabulous evening was had by all who attended!



MEMORIAM



John L. Burton S50 California Lawmaker

Former California Democratic Congressman John L. Burton, (S50), passed away on September 7, 2025, at age 92. Burton was the younger brother of Philip Burton, who also served in elected

positions in San Francisco and statewide. Mr. Burton served in the California State Assembly in the 1960s and '70s, and he briefly chaired the state's Democratic Party, and was one of the most influential figures in California politics for decades. We mourn the passing of John Burton, a political giant who made the Mustang Alumni Community proud over his many years of dedicated public service.



Gary Spratling
S59 Civil Leader

Much-beloved and respected Tiburon civil leader and friend, Gary R. Spratling, passed away on March 26, 2025. Gary was a giant in our local community and globally in the legal community, based on his leadership

at both the United States Department of Justice Antitrust Division and his nearly two decades in private practice at the law firm Gibson Dunn in San Francisco.

At Lincoln, Gary loved being a member of Mr. Lathrop's forensics team, engaging in interschool debates and "original oratory" competitions around the state. He was inducted into the Lincoln Wall of Fame in 2022.

In 1993 Gary persuaded Attorney General Janet Reno to allow the Antitrust Division to replace its voluntary disclosure program, which had not led to the detection of a single significant cartel since its inception in 1978, and adopt a novel approach: Create a prisoner's dilemma for cartel members by promising full immunity for the company and all of its employees to the first company to self-report. The Leniency Program that Gary trailblazed was unlike other U.S. Department of Justice voluntary disclosure programs when it was adopted—and that remains true today.



Lt. Col. Robert Powell Senior Army Instructor

Senior Army Instructor
California Democratic Senator

Robert Powell, Jr., was born in Fitzgerald, Georgia, in 1937 but beginning in 1978, after moving to California with his family, he called San Francisco his home. He credited his extraordinary parents (Robert and Odis

Powell) for fostering his interest in education and participation in extracurricular activities. Robert attended Hampton University in Hampton, Virginia graduating with a bachelor's degree in history. He was commissioned into the United States Army as a 2nd Lieutenant. While at Hampton, Robert met and married Emily Alfreda Redd, a fellow student at Hampton. They have two lovely daughters, Robin and Rhonda Powell.

Robert then embarked on a 23-year military career beginning at Fort Benning, Georgia and included assignments in Augsburg, Germany; Berlin, Germany; Fort Gordon, Georgia, two tours of duty in Vietnam; Fort Huachuca, Arizona; the Command and General Staff College, at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. In September 1982 he retired from military service when serving at the Presidio of San Francisco.

Lt. Col. Powell began his second career as the Senior Army Instructor for the JROTC program at Abraham Lincoln High School from October 1982 until his retirement in June 2010. During his tenure, the Abraham Lincoln JROTC program was rated by the Department of the Army as one of the most successful JROTC programs in the Western United States. In 1992, the Department of the Army assigned Lt. Col. Powell the additional duty of Director of Army Instruction for the entire San Francisco Unified School District. From 1992 onward, Lt. Col. Powell performed two jobs, Senior JROTC instructor at Abraham Lincoln High School and the Director of all JROTC programs in the San Francisco public schools. This was a critical period. Anti-war advocates were targeting San Francisco's JROTC programs for elimination. To save these valuable programs, Lt. Col. Powell was instrumental in the formation and development of "Friends of JROTC" an organization composed of JROTC family members, educators and concerned citizens. This organization was the key element in saving the JROTC program in the San Francisco schools. Lt. Col. Powell (retired) passed away on April 13, 2025. The Mustang Community salutes him for his dedicated service and thanks Denise Smith (S88) for her donation for the Memorial to Lt. Col. Powell that took place at Lincoln in May.
